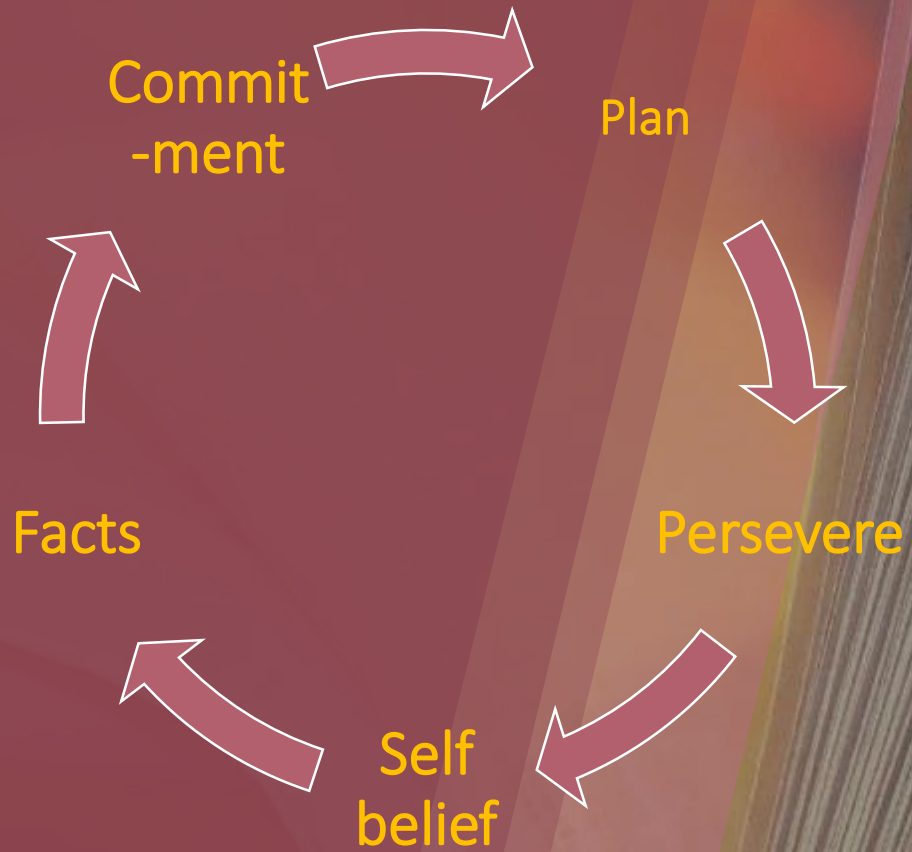

The first step is to write your IELTS exam

This is the most crucial step as-

- If you don't have any Canadian class work experience and education
- You don't have any provincial nomination
- You don't have any job offer from Canada

Step wise processing via Express Entry Program



- Apply for ECA (Educational Credential assessment) An **Educational credential assessment (ECA)** is used to verify that your foreign degree, diploma, or certificate (or other proof of your credential) is valid and equal to a Canadian one.

- Register for your IELTS examination GT, General Training, either through IDP or British Council
- The current registration fee is Rs. 13250/-
- Book for the nearest possible date like next month.
- Don't keep more gap.

IELTS preparation

- Preparation for IELTS is important.
- There are four modules-
 1. Listening
 2. Reading
 3. Writing
 4. Speaking

You can go for either coaching programs or you can easily prepare on your own.

IELTS preparation



Test format – Listening

- 30 minutes

You will listen to four recordings of native English speakers and then write your answers to a series of questions.

- Recording 1 – a conversation between two people set in an everyday social context.
- Recording 2 - a monologue set in an everyday social context, e.g. a speech about local facilities.
- Recording 3 – a conversation between up to four people set in an educational or training context, e.g. a university tutor and a student discussing an assignment.
- Recording 4 - a monologue on an academic subject, e.g. a university lecture.
- Assessors will be looking for evidence of your ability to understand the main ideas and detailed factual information, the opinions and attitudes of speakers, the purpose of an utterance and evidence of your ability to follow the development of ideas.

IELTS preparation



- Test format – Reading
- 60 minutes

The Reading section consists of 40 questions, designed to test a wide range of reading skills. These include reading for gist, reading for main ideas, reading for detail, skimming, understanding logical argument and recognising writers' opinions, attitudes and purpose.

IELTS General Training test - this includes extracts from books, magazines, newspapers, notices, advertisements, company handbooks and guidelines. These are materials you are likely to encounter on a daily basis in an English-speaking environment.

IELTS preparation



- Test format – General Training Writing
- 60 minutes

Topics are of general interest. There are two tasks:

- **Task 1** - you will be presented with a situation and asked to write a letter requesting information, or explaining the situation. The letter may be personal, semi-formal or formal in style.
- **Task 2** - you will be asked to write an essay in response to a point of view, argument or problem. The essay can be fairly personal in style.

IELTS preparation



- Test format – Speaking
- 11–14 minutes

The speaking section assesses your use of spoken English. Every test is recorded.

- **Part 1** - the examiner will ask you general questions about yourself and a range of familiar topics, such as home, family, work, studies and interests. This part lasts between four and five minutes.
- **Part 2** - you will be given a card which asks you to talk about a particular topic. You will have one minute to prepare before speaking for up to two minutes. The examiner will then ask one or two questions on the same topic.
- **Part 3** - you will be asked further questions about the topic in Part 2. These will give you the opportunity to discuss more abstract ideas and issues. This part of the test lasts between four and five minutes.

IELTS



- You need to score 7 7 7 8

i.e. 7 each in speaking, writing & reading module, while band 8 in Listening

How IELTS is scored

- IELTS results are reported on a 9-band scale
- IELTS results are designed to be simple and easy to understand. They are reported as band scores on a scale from 1 (the lowest) to 9 (the highest)

NOC code



National Occupational Classification (NOC) system to classify jobs (occupations). Jobs are grouped based on the type of:

- job duties
- work a person does

For immigration purposes, the main job groups are:

- **Skill Type 0 (zero):** management jobs
- **Skill Level A:** professional jobs that usually call for a degree from a university
- **Skill Level B:** technical jobs and skilled trades that usually call for a college diploma or training as an apprentice
- **Skill Level C:** intermediate jobs that usually call for high school and/or job-specific training
- **Skill Level D:** labour jobs that usually give on-the-job training

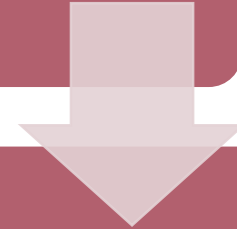

Running for documents

Just 60 days, may sound much, but believe it just goes like poofff...!!!!!!

You definitely need to run for police clearance certificate from your place of work to your place of residence.

You need to prepare documents from bank, your employer, getting the medical done

Waiting

Now you need to wait patiently as it takes 4-6 months of time. After around 30 days you will get the BIL letter. You need to book an appointment with VFS global & submit your biometrics within 30 days. [./Downloads\IMM5756_1-JK58SCR.pdf](#)



NNAS application

You can start the work front aspect i.e. going for NNAS assessment. This is a separate process, not part of Express Entry program.

This assesses your nursing education , verifies and tells you whether you are eligible to take RN examination or not.

This is in reference to your application for permanent residence. To finalize your application, we require:

1) Passports

•VFS is our trusted partner for safe and secure passport transmission. **Using VFS services is the only way to submit your passport.** Contact VFS in India (www.vfsglobal.ca/canada/india) or in Nepal (www.vfsglobal.ca/canada/Nepal) and pay the requisite fees for the **Passport Transmission Services** . *A separate envelope is required for each passport.*

•Please take this letter and present it to VFS for the purchase of the secure Passport Transmission Service. VFS will send your passport to the High Commission of Canada in New Delhi in a secure envelope. You will then be advised by VFS when your passport has been returned and is ready to be picked up.



Preparing for migration

You need to make sure about your living arrangements.

Canadian government also helps, you can have your temporary residence booked with air BNB.

Book your tickets in advance to get the cheaper one.

Pack your bags & GO.....

Make sure to migrate before expiry of your medical.
